### The Entries



- 54 entries from around New Zealand in bottles
- Plus 5 famous commercial NZ Pale Ales secretly included without the judges knowing











- The commercial beers were included to be able to compare WilliamsWarn Brewers' beers against NZ Pale Ales out in the marketplace and to check the judges' abilities and consistencies in a beer tasting competition.
- Epic was particularly important to have in the mix as it is a Pale Ale with popular US hops (Cascade) and has won NZ's Best Beer previously and is recognised as a great Pale Ale. Epic was a benchmark for the quality of the brews made by the WW Brewers.

- The System: The beers were split into two groups. Each table got half of the samples. The top 10 from each table then went to the other table. Therefore the top 20 beers got tasted by 8 tasters for an average score and the rest 4 tasters. The commercial beers also got tasted by all judges. All samples were blind tasted.
- Samples came out one at a time every 3 minutes. There was a break between every 11<sup>th</sup> sample.


- The BJCP Score Sheet was used as a template. http://www.bjcp.org/docs/SCP\_BeerScoreSheet.pdf
- Each beer is scored for Aroma, Appearance, Flavour, Mouth-feel and Overall Impression. The total points adds up to maximum 50 points.

ЭE	Outstanding	(45 - 50): World-class example of style.
SCORING GUIDE	Excellent	(38 - 44): Exemplifies style well, requires minor fine-tuning.
9	Very Good	(30 - 37): Generally within style parameters, some minor flaws.
Ž	Good	(21 - 29): Misses the mark on style and/or minor flaws.
Ö	Fair	(14 - 20): Off flavors/aromas or major style deficiencies. Unpleasant.
SC	Problematic	(00 - 13): Major off flavors and aromas dominate. Hard to drink.

 Two scores were also asked for in grey at the top of the sheet for a later analysis in NZ hop quality as part of the theme of the beer competition.

#### **The Final Results**





- WW Brewers produced the top 10 beers. Epic came 11<sup>th.</sup> The other commercial beers were scattered amongst the total.
- In general all the beers were very good. The exceptions are the entries highlighted in red which all showed a chlorophenol character. The last 3 beers were from the same brewer who also scored 9th with another great beer. We will endeavour to find out where this off-flavour may be coming from. It may be related to chlorine in water. However most of the top 10 used tap water.



# **General Quality**





- As the founder of WilliamsWarn and as an ex-professional beer taster (Denmark) I can feedback that in general the 37 WW
  beers I personally tasted were really great beers. The exception were the several samples that suffered from a very strong
  chlorophenol off-flavour and were marked down accordingly. We'll try and figure that out and feedback any findings.
- We're seriously very proud here at WilliamsWarn. Personally I scored Epic high as it should be, but half the beers I tasted were 38 ("Excellent") or above and most scored better than the other 4 commercial pale ales. The carbonation was also excellent in most samples with bubbles streaming up the beer. Well done all. We couldn't have asked for a better showing.

# Summary



- Thanks for your participation.
- We'll feedback any findings on the chlorophenol off flavour in samples from 4
  brewers. It may or may not be related to chlorine in water. We've never heard of
  this issue before and most people use tap water (which could be a source),
  including the Gold Medal beer in this competition, so it's not possible to jump to
  any conclusions yet. The fact that 3 of the brewers with the problem also made a
  good beer as an entry indicates its possible not the water itself since the same
  water source in general was used for both entries.
- But the quality of the good beers was outstanding.
  - 10 WW Brewers beat Epic.
  - 20 WW Brewers beat Moa
  - 27 WW Brewers beat Montieths
  - 32 WW Brewers beat Boundary Rd
  - 42 WW Brewers beat Stoke
  - And all of these are fine commercial beers, using millions of dollars of equipment.
